How you can help your child at home:

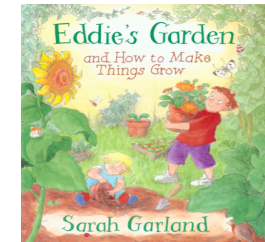
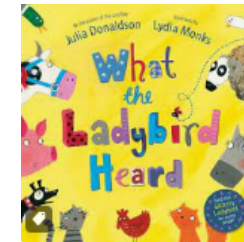
Talk about animals that live in your garden, the park, nearby, pets in the family.

Stories we will use to support our learning:

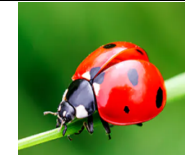


Spider



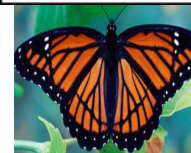
It has 8 legs.
