






## **Key Vocabulary**

**Voyage** - a long journey involving travel by sea or in space.

**Exploration** - the action of exploring an unfamiliar area.

**Vessel** - a ship or large boat.

**Ship** - a large boat for transporting people or goods by sea.

**Travel** - go from one place to another, typically over a distance of some length.

**Caravan -** a group of people, especially traders or pilgrims, travelling together across a desert in Asia or North Africa

**Legacy** - Leaving behind a legacy means making an impact that will last long after you die.
