Summer Term - April to May 2024

Aims of this theme for learning: Use key senses to explore the natural world (Sight, hearing, touch and smell). Talk about living things they observe. Comment on similarities, difference, patterns and change and ask questions about the natural world.

Key vocabulary: animals, minibeast, grass, woods, pond, field, hole, nest, burrow, den, farm, farmer, bird, insect, bees, ladybird, slug, woodlouse, earth worm, spider, caterpillar, butterfly, egg, cocoon, pig, piglet, chicken, chick, hen, cow, calf, sheep, lamb, horse, pony, cat, kitten, dog, puppy, pet, wild, farm animal, seed, plant, soil, water, sunlight.

Stories and non-fiction: our own non-fiction books about animals and plants will support teaching and learning alongside stories. The books below will be used to enhance learning across the half term.
