

Year Five Long Term Plan 2023-24

English

Reading- Pupils use a range of high quality fiction and non-fiction texts to practice retrieval, inference and deduction, prediction and summary skills. They will comment on authorial word choice. Pupils will learn how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning. Class readers studied are: Danny the Champion of the World, Coraline, Journey to Jo'burg along with poems such as Night Mail and The Highwayman. Writing- A range of text types will be studied and children will write for a range of real and relevant purposes. Writing will be linked to class readers, Geography, History, Science and school or local events. Text types include: diaries, recount, explanation texts, stories, persuasive articles and procedural. Spelling, grammar and punctuation sessions will revisit previous learning and Y5 objectives such as: use of parenthesis like brackets, dashes and commas to add extra information to sentences, use of relative clauses, show degrees of possibility using adverbs and verbs and using words and phrases to build cohesion in a paragraph.

Maths

Pupils build upon the firm foundations made and embed and develop their calculation strategies. They calculate with fractions and decimals. Pupils identify factors, multiples and square numbers. In addition, they learn long multiplication. Through regular practice they become fluent and confident arithmetic experts. Maths lessons provide children with opportunities to develop their logical and critical thinking skills whilst answering reasoning questions across a range of topics such as: geometry, measure, simple ratio and statistics. Pupils will be supported to develop their problem solving skills whilst searching for patterns and relationships and when solving open investigations.
